

Curl up with one of these recent releases by Pittsburgh-based authors and illustrators.



FEVER DREAM

Dennis Palumbo, author of Fever Dream, is a Pittsburgh native and graduate of the University of Pittsburgh. He is a former Hollywood screenwriter and now a licensed psychotherapist in a private practice, who resides in Sherman Oaks, Calif. The second in a thriller series, Fever Dream looks at Daniel Rinaldi, whose work never ceases to amaze him. After wrapping up a mysterious murder, the psychologist finds himself pulled into another case, just as demanding. When a bank robbery goes wrong and one hostage survives, Rinaldi and two investigating officers fall into kidnapping, mistaken identity, and shocking insight about a heated campaign. "Pittsburgh is a terrifically vivid kind of town - very cinematic,"

LEVI STRAUSS GETS A BRIGHT IDEA


